Dear Friends of GRMS,

On behalf of the faculty, staff, and, more importantly, the parents and students at Guadalupe Regional Middle School, I want to thank you for your generous support throughout last school year. It was an eventful and important year on many levels and for many reasons. After almost two years of interruption due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the safety protocols we had to put in place, we were able to return to normal in-person classes in our building and to some of our cherished annual events: the Fall Blessing, Trunk or Treat, the Charro Days Viewing Party, and our Scholarship Gala celebrating our 20th year of serving Brownsville community.

While the pandemic was disruptive and truly a scourge in our community, there were some hidden blessings that resulted. In-person classroom instruction and student participation are preferred by far. However, in the pandemic, we discovered new ways to maintain our connection with our students and prevent them from falling behind. Remote classes via ZOOM, the use of Google Classroom and Jupiter Ed allowed us to keep our students engaged when in-person participation was not possible. We now have sufficient laptops, tablets, and hotspots to provide our student for special projects and for remote learning when the need arises. Even now after our return to in-person classes, we use these tools.

We had a bumpy beginning in the fall of 2020. Twice after the school year started, we had to interrupt classes to implement COVID safety protocols. Nonetheless, we had a successful year graduating the class of 2022 with 21 new alumni of GRMS.

None of this could have happened were it not for our sponsors: the Sisters of the Incarnate Word & Blessed Sacrament, the Marist Brothers of the Schools, the Edmund Rice Christian Brothers. Nor could we have done it without the loyal support of the members of our Society of Our Lady of Guadalupe (local couples and individuals who make an annual pledge in support of GRMS).

Guadalupe Regional Middle School has a bright post-pandemic future because people like you believe that education (particularly Catholic education) is one of our best tools for breaking the cycle of poverty and violence that plague so many of our border communities. However, there is one small problem. Those who could most benefits from what GRMS has to offer, often do not even know that we exist—we are one of Brownsville's best kept secrets. Help us spread the word—everyone in Brownsville should know about GRMS and be proud that their city is the only city in all of Texas with such a school.


Going forward we will continue to work effectively to reach out to more students and their families, hence increasing the school's enrollment to benefit as many Brownsville residents as we can.

A member of the Edmund Rice Christian Brothers, one of the religious congregations who sponsor Guadalupe Regional Middle School, I arrived in Brownsville in July 2002 to be part of the initial faculty. A small team consisting of Br. Leo Shea FMS, Mrs. Cathy Thomas, Mrs. Patricia Flota, Mrs. April King, Br. David Concannon CFC, and Br. Bill Cronin CFC, and myself. We were optimistic and very hopeful that this project would first, get off the ground and then, perhaps be successful. We had few resources, but a lot of faith that God would be with us. We opened the doors and welcomed our first group of six graders, about 21 in all, in mid-August.

Thankfully we had some community support as well as resources from one of the sponsoring congregations that we managed to finish our first year, a year that had both happy stories and some not so. The decision was made at the end of that first year to recruit our second class. This repeated at the of the second year, then the third and continued to be repeated to the present, our 21st year.

Over time we took as our motto, 'College and Heaven', to emphasize two themes that define our existence. We are a Catholic middle school where we hold in high regard religious instruction and celebration in the life of the church through participation in the sacraments. especially the Eucharist. We afford time and opportunity for communal prayer at the start and end of the day and before each class. Another theme among teachers and students, which we attempt to put into practice, is respect for the human person as created in the image of God. Our message is: "We are created in the image of God and are therefor holy". As faculty we need to recognize our students as "Created in the image of God and therefor are holy".

The second theme we emphasize is that every student has the opportunity to fully develop their gifts academically, physically, and socially. Our hope is that our graduates will be well prepared to participate fully in the life of the high schools that they will attend. We provide them with some of the skills that will enable them to move beyond high school and into college or other professional training facilities to prepare for rewarding careers.

I have come to Guadalupe Regional Middle School so that students will be able to attend a Catholic school and receive instruction in their faith. This has not been available in many parts of the country due to the high cost of tuition to attend faith based schools. Through the blessings of the Diocese of Brownsville, our three sponsoring religious congregations, and the generosity of many donors I am privileged to have had to opportunity to serve the students and graduates of our school. Our school is 'tuition free' or nearly so to enable families of modest means to avail their children a Catholic education. This is one of the reasons I have come here from a career as a teacher in several of the school conducted by me congregation. Having a science and math background I considered myself able to assist in our project. This is a life change that I am not sorry as I have developed and grown, received much in my time here.

I have been the science and keyboarding teacher and more recently the math teacher for grades 6, 7, grade 8 pre-algebra and grade 8 algebra 1. At present I am partially retired and now am responsible for the Algebra 1 course and a variety of non-academic chores.
